Latest update on COVID-19 excerpts taken from letters to families and carers from Craig Smith (Executive Leader, Service Integrated Communities)

- While we have no community transmission of COVID-19 in NSW, Residential Aged Care Homes are still required to be on alert, and have been advised by the Public Health Unit that there have been other viral illnesses in the community.
- Anyone entering a care home is still required to be screen and temperature checked, making sure their temperature is less than 37.5 degrees Celsius and that they are not waiting on a COVID-19 result, not been caring for anyone that is unwell and not been in any locations deemed to be higher risk areas by NSW Health.
- Wearing of face masks is no longer essential for staff, volunteers or visitors. However, you can still opt to wear them, but it will be an individual choice.
